Pursuant to Court order (Notice of Ruling on Motion for Approval of Notice and Form Answer, filed Oct. 7, 2019 ("Notice of Ruling")), Defendant and Cross-Complainant City of San Buenaventura ("City"), Plaintiff Santa Barbara Channelkeeper ("Channelkeeper"), Respondent State Water Resources Control Board ("SWRCB"), Cross-Defendant Casitas Municipal Water District, and Cross-Defendants who signed below submit this Joint Status Conference Statement ("Statement"). City sent drafts of this Statement to all counsel on October 15, 21, and 24, 2019. In addition, counsel exchanged numerous e-mails regarding the Statement.

1. THIRD AMENDED CROSS-COMPLAINT

Α. RIPARIAN AND OVERLYING LANDOWNERS

As counsel for City informed the Court at the hearing on the Motion for Approval of Notice and Form Answer ("Motion for Approval"), City proposes to file a Third Amended Cross-Complaint ("3rd Am. Cross-Complaint"). The 3rd Am. Cross-Complaint will add parties who may have riparian rights to the Ventura River and its tributaries, and will provide notice of the adjudication to persons who own property that overlies one of the four groundwater basins in the Ventura River Watershed. Pursuant to legal requirements, the 3rd Am. Cross-Complaint treats these different landowners separately for pleading and service purposes.

The 3rd Am. Cross-Complaint individually names as parties each of the property owners that own land adjacent to the Ventura River and its tributaries in the caption and in the body of the pleading. The owners of approximately 500 parcels are named as parties because they own land outside of one of the four basins but adjacent to the Ventura River and its tributaries ("Riparian Landowners"). The owners of an additional approximately 1,250 parcels are named as parties because they own land overlying one of the four basins and adjacent to the Ventura River and its tributaries ("Riparian and Overlying Landowners").

The 3rd Am. Cross-Complaint addresses the service and naming of property owners only overlying one of the four basins ("Overlying Landowners") differently as required by law. At the hearing on the Motion for Approval, City initially proposed to individually name the Overlying Landowners in an exhibit and refer to them generically in the caption and the body of the pleading. However, after further reviewing the Streamlined Groundwater Adjudication Statutes, counsel for City believes the Overlying Landowners are not immediately considered to be parties to the case. California Civil Procedure Code section 836(a)(1)(A) (emphasis added) requires the notice to property owners to state in part: "you may become a party to this lawsuit by filing an answer to the lawsuit on or before the deadline specified in this notice." In other words, an Overlying Landowner only becomes a cross-defendant if he or she answers the 3d Am. Cross-Complaint.

Not individually naming the Overlying Landowners will not prevent this Court from adjudicating all water rights since this is an in rem action. Section 836(j) (emphasis added) confirms this point: "Compliance with the service and notice provisions of this chapter shall be deemed effective service of process of the complaint and notice on all interested parties of the comprehensive adjudication for purposes of establishing in rem jurisdiction and the comprehensive effect of the comprehensive adjudication." Therefore, City drafted the 3rd Am. Cross-Complaint to refer to the Overlying Landowners generically, but did not name them individually in an exhibit. As explained in Section 1.C below, City will provide the Court information regarding the Overlying Landowners to aid in processing these potential cross-defendants.

Jurisdiction in rem is a "'way of referring to jurisdiction over the interests of persons in a thing." Shaffer v. Heitner, 433 U.S. 186, 207 (1977) (citing Restatement (Second) of Conflict of Laws § 56, Introductory Note (1971)). Consistent with the Streamlined Groundwater Adjudication Statutes, in rem actions in other contexts do not specifically name potential claimants with an interest in the property. See Cal. Civ. Proc. Code § 762.060(a) (the summons in a quiet title action "may name as defendants 'all persons unknown, claiming any legal or equitable right, title, estate, lien, or interest in the property described in the complaint adverse to

plaintiff's title. . . . "); <u>Id.</u> § 861.1 (the summons in a validation action shall be directed to "all persons interested in the matter of [specifying the matter]") (brackets in original); <u>Estate of Radovich v. Citizens Nat'l Tr. and Sav. Bank of Los Angeles</u>, 48 Cal.2d 116, 120 (1957) (a probate action settles "the rights of all persons claiming as heirs of the decedent, whether or not they are named in the complaint or personally served with the summons") (citing <u>Title & Document Restoration Co. v. Kerrigan</u>, 150 Cal. 289, 307 (1906)).

B. SERVICE OF THE LANDOWNERS

As described above, the landowners added in the Third Amended Cross-Complaint fall within three categories: (1) Riparian Landowners; (2) Riparian and Overlying Landowners; and (3) Overlying Landowners. Each category raises different service issues. The City previously named all known appropriators, surface water users, and groundwater users, except for federal entities, in its Second Amended Cross-Complaint, identified as the "Original Cross-Defendants" in the Third Amended Cross-Complaint. If the City identifies additional appropriators or others with claims to the surface water or groundwater of the Ventura River Watershed, either pursuant to California Civil Procedure Code section 836.5, or other means, the City will name them as parties.

Because the Riparian Landowners are not immediately subject to the Streamlined Groundwater Adjudication Statutes, they will be served with the Summons and 3d Am. Cross-Complaint pursuant to California Civil Procedure Code sections 413.10 – 417.40. The Summons will use the standard form and provide 30 days to respond. Cal. Civ. Proc. Code § 412.20(a)(6).

The Riparian and Overlying Landowners may fit into either or both categories since they own land that overlies one of the four groundwater basins and is riparian to the Ventura River and its tributaries. As a result, City conservatively decided not to rely on the Streamlined Groundwater Adjudication Statutes for service of these named parties. Instead, City will serve the Riparian and Overlying Landowners with the Summons and Third-Amended Cross-Complaint like the Riparian Landowners. Id. §§ 413.10 – 417.40. Also, like the Riparian

Landowners, the Summons will use the standard form and provide 30 days to respond. <u>Id.</u> § 412.20(a)(6).

The Overlying Landowners fit squarely within the Streamlined Groundwater Adjudication Statutes, and accordingly, City will serve them with the Notice of Adjudication, Form Answer and Third-Amended Cross-Complaint as described above in Section 1.A.

C. NOTICE TO THE COURT

In its File & ServeXpress message board posting, on October 2, 2019 ("Court Posting"), the Court asked whether there is any statute or rule of court that provides the clerk of court "actual notice of who all is supposed to get summary notice pursuant to C.C.P. sec 836(d)(1) since they will be considered to have party status." City is not aware of any statute or rule of court that requires this information. Section 836(d)(1)(A) only requires City to "provide the court and all parties with notice of its acquisition of, or sufficient access, to this [property parcel numbers and addresses and owner names and addresses] information," but not the specific information it acquires. Similarly, Section 836(e) requires City to "file with the Court a notice of the completion of the mailing," but not any specifics as to who was mailed. In addition, as explained above, persons who receive the notice will only obtain party status if they file the form answer.

However, City will periodically file or lodge with the Court an Excel spreadsheet that lists the Overlying Landowners who received notice by name, address and parcel number, and lists the Overlying Landowners who filed the Form Answer. While City was not able to locate a specific provision regarding the confidentiality of this property information, City is sensitive to the individuals' privacy concerns and would appreciate the Court's guidance on how the spreadsheet should be filed with the Court, and whether it should be served on the parties.

A copy of the 3d Am. Cross-Complaint for which City seeks leave to file is attached as Exhibit A.

At the hearing on October 2, 2019, and in the Court Posting, the Court provided direction regarding the Motion for Approval. The revised Notice of Commencement of Groundwater Basins and Watershed Adjudication ("Notice of Adjudication"): (1) explains the protocols for filings by mail, personal delivery or fax at the Stanley Mosk Courthouse; (2) refers to Judge Highberger's Order providing 60 days to respond; (3) refers to the 3rd Am. Cross-Complaint; (4) states the required filing fee; (5) lists only one Best Best & Krieger LLP attorney to contact for further information to ensure consistency; and (6) provides notice of the date, time and place of community meetings to explain these proceedings. Item (5) above was not discussed at the hearing. Because a significant number of Overlying Landowners speak Spanish, City will further provide a Spanish version of the Notice of Adjudication.

The meetings described in item (6) above will be open to all potential parties and their counsel who have appeared in this case. The meetings will be conducted by City, and shall take place on:

Tuesday, December 10, 2019, 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Oak View Community Center, Kunkle Room 18 Valley Road Oak View, CA 93022

Wednesday, December 18, 2019, 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Bell Arts Factory, Community Room 432 N. Ventura Ave Ventura, CA 93001

Also pursuant to the hearing on the Motion to Approve, the proposed revised Order Granting City's Motion for Approval: (1) sets forth the filing protocols with the Stanley Mosk Courthouse; (2) provides 60 days to respond to the 3rd Am. Cross-Complaint; (3) refers to the 3rd Am. Cross-Complaint; and (4) deletes the reference to waiver of the appearance fee.

Copies of the revised English Notice of Adjudication, revised Spanish Notice of Adjudication, and revised Order Granting City's Motion for Approval are attached as Exhibits B

C, and D, respectively.

3. NEUTRAL WEBSITE

City will establish and maintain during the pendency of litigation a neutral website containing pleadings, reports, notices, party information contemplated by the Order for Stay, signed August 23, 2019, and discovery if the stay is lifted. Parties who have appeared in the case shall have access to file and review information on the website. City proposes the following address for the website: venturariverwatershedadjudication.com . City proposes to use the following vendor to host and maintain the website: JND Legal Administration, 1-800-207-7160, and www.jndla.com.

4. INTERVENTION

The SWRCB and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife intend to file separate motions to intervene pursuant to Section 837. The SWRCB is not named as a cross-defendant in the adjudication and intends to move to formally intervene in an abundance of caution to ensure party status. Those motions should be filed before November 1, 2019.

5. <u>SETTLEMENT</u>

As explained to the Court at the hearing on the Motion for Approval, City and Channelkeeper have settled Channelkeeper's past claims, but preserved Channelkeeper's future claims until such time as a final judgment is entered in this case. Furthermore, City and the consumptive users who participated in the mediation sessions have been holding weekly conference calls and had several in person meetings to settle the entire case. Those parties are making good progress towards the goal of agreeing to a physical solution.

A physical solution will resolve "conflicting claims in a manner that advances the

- 100. Lake Casitas is a man-made reservoir located in the Watershed primarily filled by runoff from Coyote Creek and Santa Ana Creek and water diverted from the Ventura River.
- 101. The Ventura River consists of five distinct reaches starting upstream from the Pacific Ocean: Reach 1 (Pacific Ocean to Ventura River Estuary), Reach 2 (Ventura River Estuary to Foster Park), Reach 3 (Foster Park to the San Antonio Creek Confluence), Reach 4 (just above the Ventura River's confluence with San Antonio Creek to below the Robles Diversion Facility), and Reach 5 (Robles Diversion Facility to confluence of Matilija Creek and North Folk Matilija Creek).
 - 102. There are four significant groundwater basins in the Watershed:
- (a) Upper Ventura River Groundwater Basin (DWR Bulletin 118, Groundwater Basin Number 4-3.01);
- (b) Ojai Valley Groundwater Basin (DWR's Bulletin 118, Groundwater Basin Number 4-2);
- (c) Lower Ventura River Groundwater Basin (DWR's Bulletin 118, Groundwater Basin Number 4-3.02); and

- 146. City seeks a judicial determination as to the correctness of its contentions and to the amount of water the parties may utilize from the Watershed. City also seeks a declaration of its right to utilize water from the Watershed to meet its reasonable present and future needs, and 71 -

that such rights are prior and paramount to the rights, if any, of Cross-Defendants to use Watershed water for non-municipal purposes.

EIGHTH CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Declaratory Relief - Human Right to Water - Against All Cross-Defendants)

147. City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 109.

- 148. City has the right to utilize water from the Watershed to meet existing public water needs to protect the human right to water and also to utilize increased amounts of water from the Watershed as necessary to meet future public needs to protect the human right to water. City's rights to the Watershed's water exist both as a result of the priority and extent of its pueblo, appropriative, and prescriptive rights, and as a matter of law and public policy of the State of California: "It is hereby declared to be the established policy of the state that every human being has the right to safe, clean, affordable, and accessible water adequate for human consumption, cooking, and sanitary purposes." Cal. Water Code § 106.3.
- 149. Under California Water Code Section 106.3, City has a prior and paramount right to Watershed water to protect the human right to water.
- 150. An actual controversy has arisen between City and Cross-Defendants. City alleges, on information and belief, that Cross-Defendants dispute the contentions contained in the preceding paragraphs of this Cross-Complaint. City is informed and believes, and on that basis alleges, that the certain Cross-Defendants utilize water from the Watershed for purposes that are inferior to the paramount human right to water.
- 151. City seeks a judicial determination as to the correctness of its contentions and to the amount of water the parties may utilize from the Watershed to protect the human right to water. City also seeks a declaration of its right to utilize water from the Watershed to meet its reasonable present and future needs to protect the human right to water, and that such rights are prior and paramount to the rights, if any, of Cross-Defendants to use Watershed water for purposes that are inferior to the paramount human right to water.

NINTH CLAIM FOR RELIEF 2 (Declaratory Relief - Against All Cross-Defendants)

- 152. City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 109.

- 2. For a physical solution allocating City's and Cross-Defendants' reasonable and beneficial use of water affecting the Ventura River Watershed, and protecting the substantial enjoyment of their water rights;
- 3. For judicial declarations consistent with City's contentions in the Third, Fourth, Fifth, Seventh, Eighth, and Ninth Claims for Relief in this Cross-Complaint;
 - 4. For City's costs incurred in this action; and




Figure 3.3.3.2 Groundwater Basins Map






Figure 3.3.1.1.1 Drainage Network Map
