14 AND SO FAR AS WHAT I'M ATTEMPTING TO DO IS RATION 15 WHERE THE SCARCE RESOURCES ARE APPLIED IN ORDER TO HAVE AS 16 COST-EFFECTIVE AND LEGALLY AND FACTUALLY SOUND A TRIAL AS 17 POSSIBLE. AND, AT THE MOMENT, THIS TO ME SEEMS LIKE 18 SOMETHING SO COLLATERAL THAT IT REALLY OUGHT TO WAIT UNTIL 19 APRIL WHEN THE TRIAL IS HOPEFULLY BEHIND US AND THEN PICK 20 IT UP. BUT THAT IS MY CURRENT WORKING HYPOTHESIS. BUT I'LL SEE WHAT YOUR OFFER OF PROOF DOES TO SHOW ITS 21 22 IMMINENCE, MR. WHITMAN. OKAY?

18	THE COURT TO ENGAGE IN WASTED TRIAL TIME TO HAVE
19	UNDISPUTED FACTS PROVEN IN COURT THE HARD WAY, THAT'S,
20	FRANKLY, UNETHICAL BEHAVIOR BY THE LAWYER, AND I WOULD
21	RESERVE THE RIGHT TO REPORT HIM TO STATE BAR.
