CITY OF OJAI'S REQUEST FOR JUDICIAL NOTICE IN SUPPORT OF MOTION FOR JUDGMENT ON THE PLEADINGS

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Respondent requests judicial notice of the documents and facts contained therein as identified below in support of its motion for judgment on the pleadings. This request is made pursuant to Evidence Code sections 452 and 453 and the relevant case law below.

The Code of Civil Procedure authorizes the court to consider, as grounds for a motion for judgment on the pleadings, any matter which the court must or may judicially notice under Evidence Code §§ 451 or 452. (Code Civ. Proc. § 438(d).) The court may take notice of regulations and legislative enactments and official acts of any state, county or federal legislative, executive or judicial department. (Evid. Code § 452(b)-(c); see Fowler v. Howell (1996) 42 Cal.App.4th 1746, 1750 [court can take judicial notice of records and files of state administrative agencies]; Trinity Park, L.P. v. City of Sunnyvale (2011) 193 Cal. App. 4th 1014. [court may take judicial notice of official resolutions, reports, and other official acts].)] The court may also take notice of the records of any court of this state. (Evid. Code § 452(d).)

Additionally, the court may take judicial notice of "[f]acts and propositions that are not reasonably subject to dispute and are capable of immediate and accurate determination by resort to sources of reasonably indisputable accuracy." (Evid. Code §452(h).) The court shall take judicial notice of any matter specified in Evidence Code § 452 if a party requests it and gives the adverse party sufficient notice to prepare to meet the request and furnishes the court with sufficient information to enable it to take judicial notice of the matter. (Evid. Code § 453)

Cross-Complainant City of San Buenaventura ("City") alleges as follows:

INTRODUCTION

1. This Cross-Complaint seeks a judicial determination of rights to all water within the Ventura River Watershed ("Watershed"), including a comprehensive adjudication of the waters of the Ventura River and the groundwater basins located within the Watershed and their interconnected surface waters and for the imposition of a physical solution. 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BACKGROUND

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98. The Watershed is located in western Ventura County, with a small section located in eastern Santa Barbara County. The City is informed and believes that the Watershed is fanshaped and covers 226 square miles.

- 99. The Ventura River and its headwater tributary run through the center of the Watershed along a 33.5 mile stretch from its headwaters in the Transverse Ranges to the Pacific Ocean.
- 100. The Ventura River and its headwater tributary is fed by several major tributaries, including Matilija Creek, North Fork Matilija Creek, San Antonio Creek, Cañada Larga Creek, and Coyote Creek.
- 101. Lake Casitas is a man-made reservoir located in the Watershed primarily filled by runoff from Coyote Creek and Santa Ana Creek and water diverted from the Ventura River.
- 102. The Ventura River consists of five distinct reaches starting upstream from the Pacific Ocean: Reach 1 (Pacific Ocean to Ventura River Estuary), Reach 2 (Ventura River Estuary to Foster Park), Reach 3 (Foster Park to the San Antonio Creek Confluence), Reach 4 (just above the Ventura River's confluence with San Antonio Creek to below the Robles Diversion Facility), and Reach 5 (Robles Diversion Facility to confluence of Matilija Creek and North Folk Matilija Creek).
 - There are four significant groundwater basins in the Watershed: 103.
- (a) Upper Ventura River Groundwater Basin (DWR Bulletin 118, Groundwater Basin Number 4-3.01);
- (b) Ojai Valley Groundwater Basin (DWR's Bulletin 118, Groundwater Basin Number 4-2);
- (c) Lower Ventura River Groundwater Basin (DWR's Bulletin 118, Groundwater Basin Number 4-3.02); and
- (d) Upper Ojai Valley Groundwater Basin (DWR's Bulletin 118 Groundwater Basin Number 4-1) - 64 -

- 104. In its First Amended Complaint and Verified Petition for Writ of Mandate ("Complaint"), Plaintiff Santa Barbara Channelkeeper ("Channelkeeper") alleges that City's use of the Ventura River water harms the steelhead trout and its critical habitat and exceeds water quality standards. Channelkeeper also alleges City's use of water is unreasonable and violates the public trust doctrine. Channelkeeper further alleges that City's water rights are subordinate to upstream riparian and overlying groundwater rights in the Ventura River Watershed.
- 105. City is informed and believes that Cross-Defendants' use of water from the Ventura River and the Watershed's Groundwater Basins reduces the surface and/or subsurface water flow of the Ventura River.
- 106. City is informed and believes and thereon alleges that there are conflicting claims of rights to the Watershed and/or its water.
- and/or appropriative rights to water in the Watershed. City is a successor to the Mission San Buenaventura pueblo water right, which gives it a priority to use sufficient water from the Ventura River Watershed to meet its needs. It has utilized water from the Watershed for more than five years prior to the filing of this Cross-Complaint. It has used the Watershed and/or its water for reasonable and beneficial purposes; and it has done so under a claim of right in an actual, open, notorious, exclusive, continuous, uninterrupted, hostile, adverse use and/or manner for a period of time of at least five years before filing this Cross-Complaint. City holds pre-1914 appropriative water rights.
- 108. Upon information and belief, each Cross-Defendant claims a right to utilize water and threatens to increase its taking of water without regard to the City's rights. Cross-Defendants' pumping and/or diversions reduces Watershed groundwater tables and surface flows and contributes to the deficiency of the Watershed water supply as a whole.

	109.	Cross-Defendants' continued and increasing extraction and/or diversion of
Waters	shed wa	ters has resulted in, and will result in a diminution, reduction, and impairment of
the Wa	atershed	l's water supply.

110. Cross-Defendants' continued and increasing extraction and/or diversion of Watershed waters has and will deprive the City of its rights to provide water for the public health, welfare, and benefit.

FIRST CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Cal. Const. art. X, § 2 - Against All Cross-Defendants)

- 111. City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 110.
- 112. Water resources in California must be put to reasonable and beneficial use, and parties exercising a right to use water must engage in a reasonable method of use and reasonable method of diversion.
- 113. City's reasonable and beneficial use of water requires consideration of Channelkeeper's claims and Cross-Defendants' uses and diversions of water from the Ventura River or the Watershed's Groundwater Basins.
- 114. City's reasonable and beneficial use of water also requires consideration of all other uses and users in the Watershed in the context of Statewide laws favoring domestic use of water; conservation of water; service of safe, clean, affordable, and accessible water; and protection of municipal water rights.
- 115. Based on those considerations, City's use of water from the Ventura River Watershed as compared to all other uses and users is reasonable and beneficial because:
 - (a) City's water is used for domestic purposes.
- (b) City encourages conservation of water by its users, does not waste water in its operations, and only uses water for municipal purposes.
 - (c) City provides safe, clean, affordable, and accessible water.

SECOND CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Public Trust Doctrine - Against All Cross-Defendants)

- 117. City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 110.
- 118. The public trust doctrine protects the environmental values of rivers and streams in California for the benefit of the public, but is subject to parties reasonably exercising their water rights. Additionally, public trust doctrine uses are limited by the doctrine of reasonable and beneficial use.
- 119. Evaluating the City's reasonable and beneficial use of water requires consideration of all other uses and users in the Watershed.
- 120. Evaluating the City's reasonable and beneficial use of water also requires consideration of Water Code provisions and Statewide laws favoring domestic use of water; conservation of water; service of safe, clean, affordable, and accessible water; and protection of municipal water rights and the potential that non-flow related mitigation measures may reasonably reduce the quantity of water required to protect the environment and public trust resources.
- 121. Based on those considerations, City's use of water from the Ventura River and Lake Casitas is reasonable and beneficial because:
 - (a) City's water is used for domestic purposes.

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- (b) City encourages conservation of water by its users, does not waste water in its operations and only uses water for municipal purposes.
 - (c) City provides safe, clean, affordable and accessible water.
 - (d) City is exercising vested water rights.
- 122. City seeks a preliminary and permanent injunction reducing Cross-Defendants' use of surface and/or subsurface water and groundwater affecting the surface and/or subsurface flow of the Ventura River to a level of reasonable and beneficial use and a level that protects public trust resources after consideration of Channelkeeper's claims.

THIRD CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Declaratory Relief - Pueblo and/or Treaty Water Rights -Against All Cross-Defendants)

- City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 110. 123.
- 124. The City, or a portion of it, is located within the boundaries of the former Mission San Buenaventura. The designation of the Mission San Buenaventura and its subsequent secularization led to the creation of a pueblo water right. The City is a successor to the pueblo right which gives it a priority water right to use sufficient water from the Ventura River Watershed to meet its needs.
- City is located on land that used to be part of Mexico. While that land was part of Mexico, a vested water right was established on it that was subsequently recognized by the United States in the Treaty of Guadalupe-Hidalgo. City is a successor to the Mexican water right, which has a priority over any right established under California law.
- 126. City contends that each Cross-Defendant's rights to utilize water from the Watershed are subordinate to City's pueblo and/or treaty water rights and to the general welfare of the citizens, inhabitants, and customers within City's jurisdiction.

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- 127. An actual controversy has arisen between City and Cross-Defendants, and each of them. City alleges, on information and belief, that each Cross-Defendant disputes City's contentions, as described in the immediately preceding paragraph.
- 128. City seeks a judicial determination as to the correctness of its contentions and a finding as to the priority and amount of water it and each Cross-Defendant are entitled to utilize from the Watershed.

FOURTH CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Declaratory Relief - Prescriptive Water Rights - Against All Cross-Defendants)

- 129. City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 110.
- both surface and groundwater. City alleges that, for more than five years and before the date of this Cross-Complaint, it has utilized water from the Watershed for reasonable and beneficial purposes, and done so under a claim of right in an actual, open, notorious, exclusive, continuous, hostile, and adverse manner. City further alleges that each Cross-Defendant had actual and/or constructive notice of these activities, either of which is sufficient to establish City's prescriptive rights.
- 131. City contends that each Cross-Defendant's rights to utilize water from the Watershed are subordinate to City's prescriptive rights and to the general welfare of the citizens, inhabitants, and customers within City's jurisdiction.
- 132. An actual controversy has arisen between City and Cross-Defendants, and each of them. City alleges, on information and belief, that each Cross-Defendant disputes City's contentions, as described in the immediately preceding paragraph.
- 133. City seeks a judicial determination as to the correctness of its contentions and a finding as to the priority and amount of water it and each Cross-Defendant are entitled to utilize from the Watershed.

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FIFTH CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Declaratory Relief - Appropriative Water Rights - Against All Cross-Defendants)

- 134. City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 110.
- 135. City alleges that, alternatively or in addition to its prescriptive rights, it has priority pre-1914 appropriative rights to utilize water from the Watershed based upon extensive historic and beneficial use of local water in the Ventura River, including local water impounded and collected in Lake Casitas.
- 136. An actual controversy has arisen between City and Cross-Defendants, and each of them. City alleges, on information and belief, that all Cross-Defendants, and each of them, seek to prevent City from exercising its priority pre-1914 appropriative rights to utilize water from the Watershed.
- 137. City seeks a judicial determination of the rights of persons and/or entities with overlying, appropriative, and prescriptive rights to utilize water from the Watershed.

SIXTH CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Cal. Civ. Proc Code §§ 830-852 - Comprehensive Adjudication and Physical Solution - Against All Cross-Defendants)

- 138. City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 110.
- 139. The physical solution doctrine imposes a duty on this Court to resolve competing claims to water by cooperatively satisfying the reasonable and beneficial needs of each user while protecting the substantial enjoyment of their prior rights. A physical solution can achieve this result by: compelling non-flow related improvements for the protection of public trust resources thereby preserving and protecting water supply for domestic use, the highest and best use, and for irrigation use, the next highest and best use (Water Code section 106); augmenting the Watershed's water supply; and imposing other measures. The physical solution is a practical way 70 -

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of fulfilling the mandate of the California Constitution (article X, section 2) that the water resources of the State be put to use to the fullest extent of which they are capable.

- Further, the Code of Civil Procedure authorizes the comprehensive adjudication of groundwater rights, including interconnected surface waters, and the imposition of physical solution. Cal. Civ. Proc. Code §§ 830-852.
- Accordingly, City seeks a physical solution among City and Cross-Defendants 141. regarding their respective uses of surface and/or subsurface water and groundwater affecting the Ventura River.

SEVENTH CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Declaratory Relief - Municipal Priority - Against All Cross-Defendants)

- 142. City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 110.
- 143. City has the right to utilize water from the Watershed to meet existing public water needs and also to utilize increased amounts of water from the Watershed as necessary to meet future public needs. City's rights to the Watershed's water exist both as a result of the priority and extent of its pueblo, appropriative, and prescriptive rights, and as a matter of law and public policy of the State of California: "It is hereby declared to be the established policy of this State that the use of water for domestic purposes is the highest use of water and that the next highest use is for irrigation." Cal. Water Code § 106.
- California Water Code Section 106.5 provides: "It is hereby declared to be the 144. established policy of this State that the right of a municipality to acquire and hold rights to the use of water should be protected to the fullest extent necessary for existing and future uses. . . . "
- 145. Under California Water Code Sections 106 and 106.5, City has a prior and paramount right to Watershed water as against all non-municipal uses.
- 146. An actual controversy has arisen between City and Cross-Defendants. City alleges, on information and belief, that Cross-Defendants dispute the contentions contained in the preceding paragraphs of this Cross-Complaint. City is informed and believes, and on that basis - 71 -

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alleges, that the certain Cross-Defendants utilize water from the Watershed for non-municipal purposes.

147. City seeks a judicial determination as to the correctness of its contentions and to the amount of water the parties may utilize from the Watershed. City also seeks a declaration of its right to utilize water from the Watershed to meet its reasonable present and future needs, and that such rights are prior and paramount to the rights, if any, of Cross-Defendants to use Watershed water for non-municipal purposes.

EIGHTH CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Declaratory Relief - Human Right to Water - Against All Cross-Defendants)

- 148. City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 110.
- 149. City has the right to utilize water from the Watershed to meet existing public water needs to protect the human right to water and also to utilize increased amounts of water from the Watershed as necessary to meet future public needs to protect the human right to water. City's rights to the Watershed's water exist both as a result of the priority and extent of its pueblo, appropriative, and prescriptive rights, and as a matter of law and public policy of the State of California: "It is hereby declared to be the established policy of the state that every human being has the right to safe, clean, affordable, and accessible water adequate for human consumption, cooking, and sanitary purposes." Cal. Water Code § 106.3.
- 150. Under California Water Code Section 106.3, City has a prior and paramount right to Watershed water to protect the human right to water.
- 151. An actual controversy has arisen between City and Cross-Defendants. City alleges, on information and belief, that Cross-Defendants dispute the contentions contained in the preceding paragraphs of this Cross-Complaint. City is informed and believes, and on that basis alleges, that the certain Cross-Defendants utilize water from the Watershed for purposes that are inferior to the paramount human right to water.

152. City seeks a judicial determination as to the correctness of its contentions and to the amount of water the parties may utilize from the Watershed to protect the human right to water. City also seeks a declaration of its right to utilize water from the Watershed to meet its reasonable present and future needs to protect the human right to water, and that such rights are prior and paramount to the rights, if any, of Cross-Defendants to use Watershed water for purposes that are inferior to the paramount human right to water.

NINTH CLAIM FOR RELIEF

(Declaratory Relief - Against All Cross-Defendants)

- 153. City incorporates by reference the allegations of paragraphs 1 through 110.
- 154. City contends, and is informed and believes that Cross-Defendants dispute, that:
- (a) City's use of the Ventura River Watershed as compared to all other users and uses is reasonable and beneficial and does not violate the public trust doctrine.
- (b) Cross-Defendants' uses are not reasonable or beneficial and violate the public trust doctrine as compared to City's use of the Ventura River Watershed.
- 155. Therefore, an actual, present controversy exists between City and Cross-Defendants concerning City's and Cross-Defendant's use of surface and/or subsurface water and groundwater affecting the Ventura River Watershed.
- 156. City seeks a declaration and judicial determination as to the validity of its contentions set forth in this Cross-Complaint.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, City prays for the following relief:

1. For a preliminary and permanent injunction reducing Cross-Defendants' uses of surface water and groundwater affecting the surface and/or subsurface flow of the Ventura River

to a level of reasonable and beneficial use and a level that protects public trust resources after consideration of all water uses and users in the Watershed;

- For a physical solution allocating City's and Cross-Defendants' reasonable and beneficial use of water affecting the Ventura River Watershed, and protecting the substantial enjoyment of their water rights;
- 3. For judicial declarations consistent with City's contentions in the Third, Fourth, Fifth, Seventh, Eighth, and Ninth Claims for Relief in this Cross-Complaint;
- 4. For judgment against all named cross-defendants who fail to appear in this action that they are bound by the judgment and physical solution, and their water rights in the Ventura River Watershed, if any, are limited to the terms of the physical solution.
- 5. For judgment against all persons who, presently or in the future, own an interest in real property adjacent to the Ventura River or its tributaries and who fail to appear in this action that they are bound by the judgment and physical solution, and their water rights in the Ventura River or its tributaries, if any, are limited to the terms of the physical solution.
- 6. For judgment against all persons who, presently or in the future, own an interest in real property overlying the Ventura River Watershed's Groundwater Basins and who fail to appear in this action that they are bound by the judgment and physical solution, and their water rights in the Ventura River Watershed's Groundwater Basins, if any, are limited to the terms of the physical solution.
 - 7. For City's costs incurred in this action; and
 - 8. For such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.




Figure 3.3.3.2 Groundwater Basins Map






Figure 3.3.1.1.1 Drainage Network Map

Channelkeeper moves to strike the City's Second Claim for Relief (Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 25-30) alleged in the Cross-Complaint on the following grounds:

- The Second Claim for Relief does not arise out of the same transaction, occurrence, or series of transaction or occurrences that are the subject of Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition;
- The Second Claim for Relief does not assert a claim, right, or interest in the property or controversy which is the subject of Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition;
- Addition of the Second Claim for Relief to Channelkeeper's action will not serve the purposes of permissive joinder.

For each of these reasons the Second Claim for Relief alleged in the Cross-Complaint is irrelevant to the causes of action alleged in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition and is properly stricken.

Channelkeeper moves to strike the City's Third Claim for Relief (Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 31-33) alleged in the Cross-Complaint on the following grounds:

- The Third Claim for Relief does not arise out of the same transaction, occurrence, or series of transaction or occurrences that are the subject of Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition;
- The Third Claim for Relief does not assert a claim, right, or interest in the property or controversy which is the subject of Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition;
- Addition of the Third Claim for Relief to Channelkeeper's action will not serve the purposes of permissive joinder.

For each of these reasons the Third Claim for Relief alleged in the Cross-Complaint is irrelevant to the

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causes of action alleged in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition and is properly stricken.

Channelkeeper moves to strike the City's Fourth Claim for Relief (Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 34-37) alleged in the Cross-Complaint on the following grounds:

- The Fourth Claim for Relief does not arise out of the same transaction, occurrence, or series of transaction or occurrences that are the subject of Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition;
- The Fourth Claim for Relief does not assert a claim, right, or interest in the property or controversy which is the subject of Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition;
- Addition of the Fourth Claim for Relief to Channelkeeper's action will not serve the purposes of permissive joinder.

For each of these reasons the Fourth Claim for Relief alleged in the Cross-Complaint is irrelevant to the causes of action alleged in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition and is properly stricken.

Channelkeeper moves to strike the City's Prayer for Relief (Cross-Complaint, Prayer for Relief at ¶¶ 1-5) alleged in the Cross-Complaint on the following grounds:

- The Prayer for Relief does not arise out of the same transaction, occurrence, or series of transaction or occurrences that are the subject of Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition;
- The Prayer for Relief does not assert a claim, right, or interest in the property or controversy which is the subject of Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition;
- Resolution of the remedies sought in the Prayer for Relief together with Channelkeeper's action will not serve the purposes of permissive joinder.

For each of these reasons the Prayer for Relief alleged in the Cross-Complaint is irrelevant to the causes of action alleged in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition and is properly stricken.

Plaintiff and Petitioner Santa Barbara Channelkeeper ("Channelkeeper") hereby submits its

Points and Authorities in Support of its Motion to Strike the City of San Buenaventura's ("the City")

First Amended Cross-Complaint ("Cross-Complaint").

I. INTRODUCTION

The facts alleged in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition pertain solely to the *City's* unreasonable use of Reach 4 of the Ventura River ("River") from April through October. Based on this limited transaction, Channelkeeper asks only that the Court issue a declaratory judgment finding that the City's use is unreasonable, and a writ of mandate to compel the State Water Resources Control Board ("State Board") to prevent that unreasonable use and consider the resulting impacts to public trust resources. Yet, via its allegations in the Cross-Complaint, the City attempts to join over 400 competing water rights holders on the entirety of the River, Lake Casitas, the Ojai Valley Groundwater Basin, Matilija Creek, the North Fork of Matilija Creek, San Antonio Creek, the Upper Ventura River Groundwater Basin, the Lower Ventura Groundwater Basin, and the Upper Ojai Groundwater Basin. Thus the transactions at issue in the Cross-Complaint relate to each water right holder's uses of each of these surface and ground waters. As its remedies, the City asks that the Court determine the amount of water each user may reasonably and beneficially divert. Because the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint do not arise out of the same transaction or occurrence, or series of transactions or occurrences, at issue in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition, the City may not join the 400-plus competing water users.

Similarly, the City's attempt to join other water users fails because there are no claims, interests, or rights to property at issue in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition. Channelkeeper's causes of action address the City's unreasonable use of the River. No water right holder has a property right to an unreasonable use of the State's waters. Nor does the Cross-Complaint allege causes of action that assert claims, interests, or rights in the controversy raised by Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition—Channelkeeper's controversy is with the City and the State Board only. And the City's controversy is with its competing water users only.

In any event, joinder of the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint with the causes of action raised in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition would in no way serve the purposes of

For each of these reasons, the Cross-Complaint is not filed in conformity with California's joinder rules, and the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint are irrelevant to Channelkeeper's complaint and writ and are properly stricken.

II. STATEMENT OF FACTS AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

A. Santa Barbara Channelkeeper's Complaint and Writ Petition.

Channelkeeper's mission is to protect and restore the Santa Barbara Channel and its tributaries, including the River, for the benefit of its ecosystems and the surrounding human communities. (Verified Petition for Writ of Mandate ("Pet.") at ¶ 5.) In furtherance of this mission, Channelkeeper filed its present complaint and writ petition to prevent the City's ongoing unreasonable use of the River, and to compel the State Board to prevent the City's ongoing unreasonable use of the River. (See, e.g., Pet. at ¶¶ 1-2.)

Specifically, Channelkeeper requests focused relief: (1) a judgment declaring that the City's use of Reach 4 of the River from April through October is unreasonable in violation of Article X, section 2 of the California Constitution, (2) a writ of mandate compelling the State Board to perform its mandatory duties to prevent unreasonable use of the State's waters by conducting an analysis of the City's pumping and diversion of water from Reach 4 of the River based on existing conditions in the River, and to consider impacts to public trust resources resulting from the City's use of Reach 4, as required by Article X, section 2 of the California Constitution, section 275 of the Water Code, and the Public Trust Doctrine, and/or (3) a writ of mandate enjoining the State Board from further abuse of discretion in failing to conduct an analysis of the reasonableness of the City's use of Reach 4 of the River. (Pet. at ¶¶ 1-2.)

B. The City's Cross-Complaint.

The City's Cross-Complaint alleges four claims for relief against seven named cross-defendants and Does 1-400. (See Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 1-10, 19-37.) The City's requested relief is: (1) a preliminary and permanent injunction reducing the 400 plus cross-defendants' use of surface and/or subsurface water and groundwater affecting the surface and/or subsurface flow of the River to a level of

 reasonable and beneficial use after consideration of Channelkeeper's claims, (2) a preliminary and permanent injunction reducing 400 plus cross-defendants' use of surface and/or subsurface water and groundwater affecting the surface and/or subsurface flow of the Ventura River to a level of reasonable and beneficial use and a level that protects public trust resources after consideration of Channelkeeper's claims, (3) a physical solution among the City and the 400 plus cross-defendants, and (4) a declaration and judicial determination as to the validity of the contentions set forth in the Cross-Complaint after consideration of Channelkeeper's claims. (Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 24, 30, 33, 35-37.)

The seven named cross-defendants are water rights holders that divert water along the entirety of the River, as well as from the Ojai Valley Groundwater Basin. (Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 1-8.) Does 1-400 are alleged to operate wells and/or diversions on Matilija Creek, North Fork Matilija Creek, San Antonio Creek, the Upper Ventura River Groundwater Basin, the Lower Ventura Groundwater Basin, and the Upper Ojai Groundwater Basin. (Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 9-10.) The City states that the Court can address its claims "after consideration" of Channelkeeper's claims. (See Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 24, 30.)

III. STATEMENT OF THE LAW

A. Cross-Complaint.

"A party against whom a cause of action has been asserted in a complaint or cross-complaint may file a cross-complaint setting forth either or both of the following:

- (a) Any cause of action he has against any of the parties who filed the complaint or crosscomplaint against him. []
- (b) Any cause of action he has against a person alleged to be liable thereon, whether or not such person is already a party to the action, if the cause of action asserted in his cross-complaint (1) arises out of the same transaction, occurrence, or series of transactions or occurrences as the cause brought against him or (2) asserts a claim, right, or interest in the property or controversy which is the subject of the cause brought against him." (C.C.P. § 428.10.)

B. Motion to Strike a Cross-Complaint.

California Code of Civil Procedure section 435(b) provides, "Any party, within the time allowed to respond to a pleading may serve and file a notice of motion to strike the whole or any part thereof, but this time limitation shall not apply to motions specified in subdivision (e)." (C.C.P. § 435(b)(1).)

"The court may, upon a motion made pursuant to Section 435, or at any time in its discretion, and upon terms it deems proper:

- (a) Strike out any irrelevant, false, or improper matter inserted in any pleading. [or]
- (b) Strike out all or any part of any pleading not drawn or filed in conformity with the laws of this state, a court rule, or an order of the court." (C.C.P. § 436.)

IV. ARGUMENT

The City's Cross-Complaint is properly stricken, as it fails to meet the standard for joinder under section 428.10(b) and includes allegations irrelevant to Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition.

The causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint aimed at more than 400 water rights holders do not arise out of the transaction at issue in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition. Further, the City's Cross-Complaint does not, and cannot, allege causes of action pertaining to a claim, right, or interest in the property or controversy at issue in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition because Channelkeeper's action raises no property rights disputes, and the controversy concerns only the City's use of one limited reach of the River. Finally, the joining of causes of action alleged against the cross-defendants would be inconsistent with the purpose of permissive joinder.

A. The Causes of Action Alleged in the Cross-Complaint Do Not Arise out of the Same Transaction, Occurrence, or Series of Transactions or Occurrences at Issue in Channelkeeper's Complaint and Writ Petition.

Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition is focused solely on the *City's* unreasonable use of the River. Thus the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint in no way arise out of the same transaction or occurrence, or series of transaction or occurrences, at issue in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition.

A party may join a third party via a cross-complaint if the causes of action asserted in the cross-complaint arise out of the same transaction, occurrence, or series of transactions or occurrences as the causes of action alleged against that party in the complaint. (See C.C.P. § 428.10(b)(1).) To determine whether causes of action arise out of the same transaction, occurrence, or series of transaction and occurrences, courts ask whether the claims are logically interrelated. (See Align Technology, Inc. v. Tran

(2009) 179 Cal. App. 4th 949, 961 (discussing definition of "transaction").)1

Channelkeeper's causes of action are not part of the same transaction or occurrence as the causes of action the City alleges against the third party cross-defendants, as those causes of action are not interrelated. The "transaction" of Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition is the City's unreasonable use of the River. Specifically, Channelkeeper's allegations relate only to the City's unreasonable pumping and diversions from a limited stretch of the River—Reach 4—from April through October. (See Pet. at ¶ 1, 105-128, 129-134, 140-144.) Channelkeeper only seeks remedies related to this narrow transaction. (See Pet. at ¶ 145-176.) To determine that the City's use of the River is unreasonable and that the State Board must act the Court need not review other specific uses. (Joslin v. Marin Mun. Water Dist. (1967) 67 Cal.2d 132, 140-41; Tulare Irrigation Dist. v. Lindsay-Strathmore Dist. (1935) 3 Cal.2d 489, 567; see also Imperial Irrigation Dist. v. State Water Res. Control Bd. (1990) 225 Cal.App.3d 548, 568-69) (explaining that competing water users need not be included in an action to determine the reasonableness of a single user's exercise of its water right); Light v. State Water Res. Control Bd. (2014) 226 Cal.App.4th 1463,1479-81 (internal citations omitted); Carrancho v. Cal. Air Res. Control Bd. (2003) 111 Cal.App.4th 1255, 1266; see also Sec. IV.B.2., below.)

In contrast, the factual allegations in the Cross-Complaint relate to the amounts of surface and ground water that can be diverted between competing water users. (See Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 1-9, 18.) Based on these alleged facts, the City asks that the Court issue preliminary and permanent injunctions reducing the 400-plus cross-defendants' uses of the River, Lake Casitas, Matilija Creek, North Fork Matilija Creek, San Antonio Creek, the Upper Ventura River Groundwater Basin, the Lower Ventura Groundwater Basin, and the Upper Ojai Groundwater Basin, and for a physical solution among the City and the cross-defendants. (See Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 24, 30, 33, 35-37.) To resolve the questions raised by the Cross-Complaint the Court will determine the amounts of water each user is entitled to divert based on their respective water rights. (See, e.g., City of Barstow v. Mojave Water Agency (2000) 23

(2014) 58 Cal,4th 901, 906 (internal citations omitted).)

¹ While the court in *Align Technology*, *Inc. v. Tran* considered the definition of transaction or occurrence in the context of a compulsory cross-complaint, section 428.10(b)(1) uses the same statutory language. "When the same word appears in different places within a statutory scheme, courts generally presume the Legislature intended the word to have the same meaning each time it is used." (*People v. Gray*

Cal.4th 1224, 1249-50.) Channelkeeper's complaint and writ does not implicate these legal issues. (See Pet. at ¶¶ 1-2, 145-176.)

Comparison of the City's Cross-Complaint with the cross-complaint at issue in *Roylance v*.

Doelger demonstrates that the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint do not arise out of the same transaction. In *Roylance v*. *Doelger*, the cross-complaint was based on the discrete facts of the same transaction at issue in the complaint—what caused a property to collapse—and the cross-plaintiff requested the same amount of monetary relief sought in the complaint from cross-defendants. (*Roylance v. Doelger* (1962) 57 Cal.2d 255, 257-58.) The Supreme Court reasoned that the cross-complaint was proper because the complaint and cross-complaint presented a single set of facts. (*Id.* at 259-261.) Here, the facts alleged in the Cross-Complaint are in no way the same as those at issue in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition. Nor does the City seek the same relief as Channelkeeper.

Similarly, the City's Cross-Complaint is not analogous to cross-complaints brought against third parties in most circumstances, which typically seek indemnification. (See, e.g., Am. Motorcycle Ass'n v. Superior Court (1978) 20 Cal.3d 578, 605-606.) The City does not seek indemnity from the cross-defendants. Nor is Channelkeeper a water right holder against whom the cross-defendants might have claims.

Because the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint do not arise out of the same transaction or occurrence, or series of transaction or occurrences, raised in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition, those causes of action are not properly joined via section 428.10(b)(1).

B. The City's Attempt To Join Other Water Users Fails Because There Are No Claims, Interests, or Rights To Property At Issue In Channelkeeper's Complaint And Writ Petition and the Controversy Raised in Channelkeeper's Action is Between Channelkeeper, the City, and the State Board Only.

A party may join a third party by cross-complaint where a cause of action alleged in the cross-complaint "asserts a claim, right, or interest in the property or controversy which is the subject of the case brought against him." (C.C.P. § 428.10(b)(2).) Because Channelkeeper's action implicates no property rights about which the Cross-Complaint could allege any claims, interests, or rights, and given that the controversy raised in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition is between Channelkeeper, the City, and the State Board only, the City's Cross-Complaint fails to satisfy the requirements of

section 428.10(b)(2).

1. There is no Property Right at Issue in Channelkeeper's Complaint and Writ Petition.

Cases allowing cross-complaints under section 428.10(b)(2) are based on claims involving actual property rights. (See, e.g., Roylance, 57 Cal.2d at 257 (cross-complaint relating to interests in real property); see also Dep't of Public Works v. Clausen (1967) 248 Cal.App.2d 770, 782-84 (cross-complaint regarding trespass to land).)

Here, however, there is no property right at issue. A water user cannot acquire a vested right to the unreasonable use of water. (*In re Waters of Long Valley Creek Stream Sys.* (1979) 25 Cal.3d 339, 354 (holding that "there can no longer be any property right in the unreasonable use of water"); *see also Joslin*, 67 Cal.2d at 144-45; *Light*, 226 Cal.App.4th at 1488-89 ("No party can acquire a vested right to appropriate water in a manner harmful to public trust interests, and the state has an affirmative duty to take the public trust into account in regulating water use by protecting public trust uses whenever feasible.") (internal citation omitted).) A water right holder's water use is properly involuntarily curtailed based on the unreasonableness of the use. (*See, e.g., Joslin*, 67 Cal.2d at 140-45.) No compensation for such curtailment is required. (*Id.* at 145 ("since there was and is no property right in an unreasonable use there has been no taking or damaging of property by the deprivation of such use and, accordingly, the deprivation is not compensable").) Accordingly, as Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition is aimed at addressing the City's unreasonable use of the River and compelling the State Board to act on its mandatory duties, the Cross-Complaint cannot assert a claim, right or interest in property pursuant to section 428.10(b)(2).

2. The Controversy Raised by Channelkeeper's Complaint and Writ Petition is Between Channelkeeper, the City, and the State Board Only.

The City's Cross-Complaint does not assert a claim, right or interest in the controversy raised by Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition because the controversy is between Channelkeeper, the City, and the State Board only. While the Cross-Complaint alleges that the "City's reasonable and beneficial use of water requires consideration of [Channelkeeper's] claims and Cross-Defendants' use and diversions of water from the Ventura River or the Watershed's Groundwater Basins," (see Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 21, 27), the City is simply wrong.

Specifically, whether the City's use of the River is unreasonable does not depend on other specific uses. Courts determine the reasonableness of a single water right holder's use based only on that right holder's use and statewide considerations of transcendent importance. (See Joslin, 67 Cal.2d at 140-41; Tulare Irrigation Dist., 3 Cal.2d at 567; see also Imperial Irrigation Dist., 225 Cal.App.3d at 568-69); Light, 226 Cal.App.4th at 1479-81 (internal citations omitted).) And determining whether the State Board has a mandatory duty is simply a matter of statutory construction in no way implicating other users' water rights. (See, e.g., Carrancho, 111 Cal.App.4th at 1266.) In apparent recognition of the independence of Channelkeeper's action and its Cross-Complaint, the City requests relief after Channelkeeper's action is resolved. (See Cross-Complaint at ¶¶ 24, 30, 35, and at 8:20-9:1.)

Further, in overruling and denying the City's demurrer and motion to strike for Channelkeeper's nonjoinder of other users of the River, this Court recognized that the reasonableness of a use of the State's waters does not depend on an analysis of other specific uses. (Declaration of Caroline Koch in Support of Motion to Strike ("Koch Dec.") at ¶ 3, and Ex. A at 17:4-15.) The Court reasoned that the reasonableness of a single water user's use of the State's waters is decided by following the factors and criteria established by the California courts, and that other water users need not be joined for the Court to apply those criteria. (*Id.*, Ex. A at 14:23-15:23.) Accordingly, the controversy about the unreasonableness of the City's use of the River in no way concerns the specific uses of the 400-plus cross-defendants.

Because Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition raises no interests in property and the controversy concerns only Channelkeeper, the City, and the State Board, the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint cannot assert a claim, interest, or right in the property or controversy that is the subject matter of Channelkeeper's action. As such, the Cross-Complaint fails to satisfy the requirements of section 428.10(b)(2).

C. Adding the Third Party Cross-Defendants and the Expansive Causes of Action Alleged in the Cross-Complaint Would Not Serve the Purposes of Joinder.

Given that the causes of action at issue in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition do not relate to the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint, adding the third party cross-defendants and the City's expansive causes of action would not serve the purposes of permissive joinder.

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The purpose of allowing a cross-complaint against previously unjoined third parties—a permissive cross-complaint—under the circumstances outlined section 428.10(b) is to avoid a multiplicity of suits and to enable a final and binding judgment upon all the matters in dispute between the parties. (See Nominelli Construction Co. v. Harris (1969) 272 Cal. App. 2d 352, 357 (citing Millar v. Millar (1921) 51 Cal. App. 718, 722).) Cross-complaints on causes of action arising out of the same transaction or occurrence as the complaint are also meant to eliminate duplication of effort thereby serving judicial economy. (See Align Technology, Inc., 179 Cal. App. 4th at 961 (explaining that the purpose of concurrent litigation of related causes of action is to avoid duplication of time and effort.) The Cross-Complaint does not fit within either purpose.

First, the City's Cross-Complaint does not avoid a multiplicity of suits. As discussed above, the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint do not arise out of the same transaction, occurrence, or series of transaction and occurrences at issue in Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition. Channelkeeper's causes of action against the City and the State Board concern only Channelkeeper, the City, and the State Board. Nor do any of the cross-defendants have any claims against Channelkeeper that would be appropriately litigated together with Channelkeeper's claims against the City.

Second, considering the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint together with Channelkeeper's claims against the City and the State Board would not promote judicial economy and efficiency. To decide the expansive causes of action alleged in the City's Cross-Complaint, the City and the third party water users will likely need to conduct extensive discovery, including submission of expert testimony. (See, e.g., City of Santa Maria v. Adam (2012) 211 Cal. App. 4th 266, 290.) The City has indicated that it intends to conduct discovery on the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint. (Koch Dec., ¶ 4.) However, to prove its claims, Channelkeeper does not intend to conduct any discovery. Based on the evidence submitted with Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition alone, the City's use of Reach 4 of the River from April through October is unreasonable and it cannot be reasonably disputed that the State Board has failed to carry out mandatory duties. (See Light, 226 Cal.App.4th at 1479-80 (citing Tulare Irrigation Dist., 3 Cal.2d at 567); Joslin, 67 Cal.2d at 141 (holding that the use at issue was "as a matter of law unreasonable within the meaning of the constitutional amendment"); Answer of Respondent State Water Resources Control Board at ¶¶ 129-

133; see also, e.g., Answer of Defendant City of San Buenaventura at ¶ 111-119, 124.)

Moreover, the City should not be permitted to file a cross-complaint to dictate the scope and complexity of Channelkeeper's action. (See, e.g., Thornton v. Luce (1962) 209 Cal.App.2d 542, 551 ("a plaintiff should be able to control his case by proceeding against the party or parties whom he feels to be most clearly liable.").)

Given that none of the purposes of joinder will be served if the Court were to consider the City's Cross-Complaint with Channelkeeper's complaint and writ petition, the Cross-Complaint is properly stricken.

V. CONCLUSION

For each of these reasons, the causes of action alleged in the Cross-Complaint are properly stricken.

The above-captioned matter came on regularly for hearing before the Court on Wednesday,

August 26, 2015, on Petitioner and Plaintiff Santa Barbara Channelkeeper's ("Plaintiff") Motion to

Strike Defendant and Cross-Complainant City of San Buenaventura's ("the City") First Amended Cross-Complaint ("cross-complaint").

Caroline Koch of Lawyers for Clean Water, Inc. appeared on behalf of Plaintiff. Gene Tanaka and Shawn Hagerty of Best & Krieger LLP appeared on behalf of the City. Matthew Bullock of the California Attorney General's Office appeared on behalf of the State Water Resources Control Board.

The Court has considered the motion, the City's opposition, the State Board's opposition to Plaintiff's Motion for a Separate Trial filed concurrently with its Motion to Strike, Plaintiff's replies, and the parties' arguments presented at the August 26 hearing.

Petitioner Santa Barbara Channelkeeper's Motion to Strike First Amended Cross-Complaint is GRANTED for the following reasons:

- the reasonable use and public trust doctrines do not require the Court to examine other specific competing water rights on the river to resolve the actual relief that Plaintiff is requesting;
- 2) the Court finds that the City of Buenaventura's cross-complaint does not arise from the same transaction or occurrence as Plaintiff's claim because the only transaction at issue in Plaintiff's complaint is whether or not the City of Buenaventura's water use is unreasonable;
- 3) the Court finds that Plaintiff's claim does not implicate a property right. Only the City's unreasonable use of the river is at issue; and
- 4) finally, the City of Buenaventura's cross-complaint joining of numerous other parties that the city wishes to join does not prevent a multiplicity of suits or serve the purpose of judicial economy.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on December 9, 2021 at 2:30 p.m. and on December 13,
2021 at 4:00 p.m., in Department S10 of the Los Angeles County Superior Court, this Court held
Order to Show Cause hearings as to why the Court should not issue an order establishing (1) the
boundaries of the Ventura River Watershed (Watershed), as defined by the U.S. Geological
Survey (USGS) National Hydrography Dataset and Watershed Boundary Dataset and (2) the
boundaries of the Watershed's four groundwater basins, as defined by the California's
Department of Water Resources (DWR) in Bulletin 118, in advance of the Phase 1 Trial.

THIS COURT ORDERS as follows:

- Watershed Boundaries. The boundaries of the Ventura River Watershed
 (Watershed) are the boundaries defined by the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS)
 National Hydrography Dataset and Watershed Boundary Dataset as 10-digit
 Hydrologic Unit Code (HUC) 1807010101 Ventura River Watershed as of the
 date of this order. USGS may adjust these boundaries from time to time. This
 order is without prejudice to any party arguing that the Court needs to consider
 the adjacent Santa Clara River Watershed before making any final determination
 in Phase 1 Trial.
- 2. Groundwater Basin Boundaries. Summary

The Ojai Valley groundwater basin is located in the central-western portion of Ventura County. The basin is bound on the north by consolidated rocks of the Topatopa Mountains. The easternmost portion of the basin is separated from the adjacent Upper Ojai Valley groundwater basin by the San Cayetano fault. The basin is bound on the south by the Santa Ana fault and the consolidated rocks of Black Mountain. A surface water divide and a subsurface bedrock ridge that forms a groundwater divide separates the basin from the adjoining Upper Ventura River subbasin to the west. South of the Santa Ana fault, thin terrace deposits underlain by bedrock and lacking direct subsurface hydraulic connection with the basin are excluded from the basin. These alluvial terrace deposits have little to no significant groundwater storage capacity. The boundary is defined by 13 segments detailed in the descriptions below.

Segment Descriptions


