

'Notice is hereby given that the Santa Ana Water Company, a body duly incorporated under the laws of the State of California, and whose principal place of business is at the Town of San Buenaventura, in the County of Santa Barbara, and State of California, desires and intends to appropriate the waters of the San Buenaventura River, or Arroyo Matilija, and of the Arroyo San Antonio, to the extent of thousand inches under a pressure of a four inch head, for the purpose of supplying water for irrigating domestic culinary stock and manufacturing purposes at various points along the line of the ditches and other works of said company, already constructed or that may hereafter be constructed, and for supplying the Town of San Buenaventura and its inhabitants and the vicinity of said Town, with fresh water, by diverting the said water from its natural channels, by erecting suitable dams, wings, gates & c. at or near the confluence of said streams, and by conducting the same by means of ditches, flumes, pipes, aqueducts and reservoirs from the confluence of said streams or thereabouts, through lands of the Ranchos Santa Ana Canada Larga, ex-Mission of San Buenaventura to the Town of San Buenaventura, and in said Town and through all the streets according to the maps & survey of said works filed and to be filed in the

Office of the County Clerk of the County of Santa Barbara.
